

# Safeguarding evaluation

## Terms of Reference



Scotland's International  
Development Alliance

### Context

From 2018, safeguarding has been under considerable scrutiny following heightened media attention on the international development sector and abuses that had taken place in development and humanitarian work. It was recognised that many organisations needed support in developing policies that would strive to go beyond compliance, and towards a gold standard of safeguarding. Therefore, the Scottish Government, in collaboration with Scotland's International Development Alliance (the Alliance), set out to ensure that organisations in Scotland which are working overseas are supported in their development and implementation of safeguarding policies and procedures.

In 2018, the Scottish Government provided funding to the Alliance to ascertain the needs of organisations and to develop a range of support to organisations to improve their capacity and standards and to transform the standards of safeguarding in the sector.

In order to build on the initial work, it was recognised further work was needed to embed improvements and a dedicated project was developed with the support of Scottish Government funding and implemented by the Alliance from October 2019 to May 2021. The project has the overall objective **to transform the capacity and standards of safeguarding across the sector, with the following specific aims:**

1. To strengthen capacity in safeguarding, particularly in leadership of organisations
2. To develop the capacity of safeguarding training and expertise in Scotland
3. To ensure that resources and tools are available and appropriate for Scotland based organisations working in international development.

As it nears completion, the Alliance would now like to evaluate the project.

### Aim

Evaluation of the discrete 18-month Safeguarding Project which ran between October 2019-May 2021, whether it met the intended project outputs and delivered them in the changed context of remote working.

### Evaluation questions

- Whether the project met its outputs and delivered what it aimed to
- Drawing on the OECD DAC evaluation questions, focusing on the questions about effectiveness, sustainability and impact

### Timeline

- Contracting and references - w/b 31 May 2021
- Induction meetings and work package review - w/b 7 June 2021
- Project commencing, starting with desk review and then proceeding to the stakeholder interviews - w/b 7 June 2021

- Project completion- 30 June 2021

- Key stakeholder interviews via telephone or Skype/Zoom/Teams (circa 10?)
