- The insights in this deck compare Scottish with English/Welsh respondents; unless otherwise noted, the number denoted in parentheses is the English/Welsh figure

KEY INSIGHTS


- 1. Across the range of attitude and behavioural engagement indicators, the profiles of Scottish vs. English/Welsh respondents are *more similar than different*
- 2. Scots are more likely to support increasing the UK aid budget
- 3. Scottish respondents see the world as interconnected: they are more likely than English/Welsh respondents to say that what happens in developing countries affects people like them living in the UK
- 4. Scottish respondents are cosmopolitan in their outlook
 - However, they are not more so than the English/Welsh: 71% of Scots they have duty not to harm people living in other countries, compared to 70% for English/Welsh respondents
- 5. Scots are more likely to say UK aid should be given based on need
 - They strongly reject the notion of UK aid in the national interest























LOOKING ACROSS THE RANGE OF 'MORAL SENTIMENT' ITEMS, SCOTTISH RESPONDENTS HAVE A SIMILAR PROFILE TO ENG/WELSH RESPONDENTS: 35% OF SCOTS SAY THE UK SHOULD GIVE MORE MONEY TO OVERSEAS AID BECAUSE IT IS THE MORALLY RIGHT THING TO DO (30%)





COSMOPOLITAN VIEWS AND SDG KNOWLEDGE









UNIVERSITY^{OF} BIRMINGHAM

The Development Engagement Lab (DEL) is a five-year study of public attitudes and engagement with global development in France, Germany, Great Britain, and the United States (2018-2023).

DEL is a partner focussed research programme, convening and co-producing research and insights with over 30 international development NGOs and government agencies to understand the drivers of engagement and inform development communications.

Fieldwork is carried out by YouGov and surveys are weighted to be a nationally representative of the adult population. DEL is funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and led by Professor Jennifer Hudson (University College London) and Professor David Hudson (University of Birmingham).

The Development Engagement Lab

(Aid Attitudes Tracker Phase 2) has three goals:

- 1. Co-production of an evidence base for development campaigning
- 2. Enabling collaboration across the sector
- 3. Increasing advocacy capacity through the sharing of research and strategic insights
